# Legal Status... depends

- Security Council: Chapter VII resolutions are binding (Chapter VI, customarily are not, and are usually called "recommendations")
- General Assembly: Resolutions generally are not binding but "decisions" (resolutions essentially procedural in nature and providing instructions for the functioning of the organization) usually are.
- ECOSOC: Not legally binding



# Structure & Numbering

- One long sentence... ie one period.
- Name of body issuing the resolution
- Numbering: according to the who, what, where and when...
- Preamble: starts with gerunds and explains the reason
- Operative part: starts with numbers and expresses the opinion of the organization or the action to be take

- Values and principles
- We, heads of State and Government, have gathered at United Nations Headquarters in New York from 6 to 8 September 2000, at the dawn of a new millennium, to reaffirm our faith in the Organization and its Charter as indispensable foundations of a more peaceful, prosperous and just world.
- We recognize that, in addition to our separate responsibilities to our individual societies, we have a collective responsibility to uphold the principles of human dignity, equality and equity at the global level. As leaders we have a duty therefore to all the world's people, especially the most vulnerable and, in particular, the children of the world, to whom the future belongs.
